SECTION 2 – ACADEMIC DETAILS

2.1 Unit Descriptor

This unit extends students' knowledge of counselling theory gained in the unit Introduction to Counselling Theories by examining approaches to counselling practice in greater depth. Two counselling approaches representing two broad theoretical developments will be explored. In addition, the movement towards psychotherapy integration will be investigated and the way it informs practice will be analysed. The unit will also focus on the application of these theories to counselling practice and provide opportunity for students to continue develop their counselling skills and processes.

2.2 Learning Outcomes for Unit

Learning outcomes for unit:

- 1. Critically examine the theoretical tenets and practices of two main theories of counselling to inform clinical practice.
- 2. Evaluate the movement towards psychotherapy integration with a view to how this shapes clinical counselling practice.
- Intentionally apply appropriate and ethical use of counselling interventions in response to client concerns and be able to substantiate their use with recourse to theory and vocational ethical frameworks.
- 4. Critically reflect on personal counselling practice demonstrating advanced self-awareness around strengths and limitations of their practice, and preferred approaches.
