SECTION 2 – ACADEMIC DETAILS

Brief description of the content of the unit

This unit introduces students to a range of psychological disorders, assisting them to gain an understanding of their aetiology, characteristics and accompanying issues. It is informed by a multidimensional perspective of causality and treatment of mental illness that promotes the practice of intentionally identifying needs specific to each individual. Students will be encouraged to develop awareness of mental health presentations in context, to recognise the signs of psychological problems, preparing them to discern how to provide appropriate therapeutic assistance to facilitate optimal functioning and wellbeing.
