SECTION 2 – ACADEMIC DETAILS

Brief description of the content of the unit.

This experience builds upon MTO142.5 Internship A, further providing a context where the student is able to engage in ministry or intercultural activities, analyse their experiences, and reflect on their vocational identity and calling, particularly in regard to leadership. It connects strongly with the formation domain *Engaging Our Stories* in Tabor MTC's curriculum paradigm. The student participates under supervision in one of the following three options: 1, a 3-week short-term experience in a cross-cultural context in Australia or overseas; 2, participation in a local context (eg local church, English conversation class, welfare agency) on a weekly basis throughout the semester for approximately a day a week over 10-12 weeks; or 3, in a formal internship program run by an established NGO or denomination.

Learning outcomes for unit:

- 1. Discuss key Christian leadership principles and practices within their ministry context
- 2. Analyse internship experiences in a supervision/mentoring context, identifying personal strengths, areas for improvement, and strategies for professional development
- 3. Utilise appropriate planning, organisational, and communication skills relevant to their area of ministry/intercultural involvement and a supervisor/mentor relationship
- 4. Reflect on their vocational identity and calling, and possible future ministry or intercultural directions and options
