SECTION 2 – ACADEMIC DETAILS

Brief description of the content of the unit (key topics):

This unit explores a 'triage' approach to Christian pastoral care in relation to life-cycle stages and life issues. It connects strongly with the formation domain *Engaging the World & Others' Stories* in Tabor MTC's curriculum paradigm. *Pastoral Care in Context* is designed to equip students with the knowledge, skills and dispositions needed for assessing and addressing a variety of pastoral care issues and situations, with an emphasis upon resources for referral. Key topics covered include pastoral care and: young people and families; relationships and marriage; infertility and early pregnancy loss; vocation and work; aging, dying and loss; crises and illness; disability and mental illness; spiritual oppression; addiction; gender and sexuality.

Learning outcomes for unit:

- 1) Explain key issues involved in ministry related to specific pastoral care contexts (e.g. typical presenting issues, scope of impact, theological issues etc.) with reference to the biblical text and contemporary scholarship
- 2) Theologically reflect upon and analyse their experiences of giving care related to a life-cycle stage (e.g. adolescence, aging) or life issue (e.g. addiction, sexuality), with self-awareness of their unique capacity and skills as a pastoral carer
- 3) Analyse the significance and relevance of life-cycle stages and life issues for pastoral care ministry, and identify possible responses and resources for referral
